How do I as the employer check the eligibility of my employee or volunteer?

They must be:

- Over 19
- Living or working in the East Midlands
- Employed or a volunteer for a charity, voluntary or community organisation for 16 hours or more per week

Every apprentice and organisation will be supported by a VCS Workforce Development Advisor and each will receive a tailored programme to meet their needs.

There are a number of initiatives available to organisations, offering guidance and funding to develop the skills of their volunteers and employees. Please ask your VCS Workforce Development Advisor about the Train to Gain service and Skills Pledge.

These are: Derbyshire Learning & Development Consortium; VOCOLLS, Leicestershire; enable, Nottinghamshire; Lincolnshire and Rutland Learning and Skills Consortium, Lincolnshire and Northamptonshire Skills and Learning Consortium.

Each organisation is responsible for driving forward a Voluntary and Community Sector (VCS) Workforce Development Strategy in their county and has a track record of managing and delivering workforce development activities to meet VCS organisational needs.



Apprenticeships – The proven way to train your workforce

What is an Apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship is a work-based training programme designed around the needs of an employer, which lead to recognised qualifications. You can train both new and existing employees. Most of the training is 'on the job' at your premises and the rest can be provided by a local college or specialist training provider.

All apprentices must learn key skills that support individuals in their job. These include Communication and Application of Number. They may also include other key skills such as Information and Communication Technology, Working with Others and Problem Solving.

There are three levels of Apprenticeship available: Apprenticeships (equivalent to five good GCSEs; Advanced Apprenticeships (equivalent to two A-Level passes) and Higher Apprenticeships (work towards NVQ Level 4)

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WHAT IS AVAILABLE UNDER THE VCS APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMME?

Are you looking for a well trained, flexible and diverse workforce?

This is a unique Apprenticeship programme open to volunteers and existing voluntary and community sector employees aged over 19, who have low or no prior qualifications, or hold higher level qualifications not relevant to working in the voluntary and community sector.

The programme lasts between 8 and 18 months depending on the starting point and needs of your apprentice. They may need to attend a college or training provider on a day release arrangement. But their knowledge and work experience is assessed through a portfolio of evidence and observations in the work place. The Technical Certificate is assessed by exam multiple choice questions and Key Skills assessed by a test and/or portfolio.

The Apprenticeship programme is fully funded by the European Social Fund (ESF) along with support for travel, childcare and family care costs.
